## ~Imminence shown by NT Writers~

**John the Baptist** warned of the wrath <u>about to</u> come. (Matt 3:7; Lk. 3:7) He said <u>even now</u> the ax is laid to the root of the tree. (Matt. 3:10; Lk. 3:9-17) His winnowing fork is in His hand, and He will thoroughly clear His threshing floor; and He will gather His wheat into the barn, but He will burn up the chaff with unquenchable fire. Matt 3: 12)

• Jesus said that his coming would be <u>before the apostles had gone through the cities of Israel.</u> (Matt. 10:23) • There would be <u>some standing here who shall not taste death till they see the Son of Man coming</u> <u>in his kingdom</u>. (Matt. 16:28; Mk. 9:1)

• Jesus condemned his generation and warned of them of the coming judgment that would befall them. (Matt. 11:22-24; Matt. 23:35-36). • The coming and judgment was said to be in <u>his generation</u> (Matt. 12:41-42; Matt. 23:35-37; Mk. 13:30; Lk. 11:29-32; Lk. 21:31-32) • His judgment would be against Jerusalem who killed the apostles and prophets (Matt. 23:35-38; Matt. 24:34; Mk. 5:11; Lk. 11:50; Lk. 13: 34-35)• He will avenge his saints who are crying out to him. (Lk. 18:7-8) • I come <u>quickly</u>. (Rev. 1:5; 2:16; 3:3; 3:11)

**Peter** said salvation was <u>ready to be revealed</u> in the last time. (1 Pet. 1:5) • <u>In a little while</u> trials and suffering would turn to honor and praise at Christ's coming. (1 Pet. 1:6-7) • The judge is ready to judge the living and the dead. (1 Pet. 4:5) • The end of all things was <u>at hand</u>. (1 Pet 4: 7) • The <u>hour has come</u> for judgment to begin at the house of God. (1 Pet. 4:17)

• Those were the last days. (2 Pet 3:3) • Scoffers where denying the promise of the coming. Peter confirmed that the end of all things which were <u>at hand</u> would pass away (heavens and earth) as promised. (2 Pet. 3). • As promised by the prophets the new heavens and earth would be finally be established as a dwelling place for the righteous. (2 Pet. 3:13)

**James** said that the Coming of the Lord was at hand and the judge was standing <u>at the door</u>. (James 4:8-9)

Paul said salvation is <u>nearer than when we first believed.</u> (Rom 13:11) • First century Christians were to <u>eagerly wait</u> for the Revelation of Jesus (1 Cor. 1:7; Ph. 3:20) • The <u>time is short</u> and to separate oneself from the world which was passing away. (1 Cor. 7:29-31) • The Lord is <u>at hand</u>. (Ph. 4:5) • Paul reconfirms Jesus message that judgment was coming against Jerusalem who killed the apostles and prophets and were filling up the measure of their sin. (1 Thess. 15-16). • There would be <u>those who would</u> be alive and remain when Christ comes. (1 Thess 3: 15-17) • Paul promised <u>the Thessalonians</u> relief from their trails when Christ would come. (2Thess. 1:7-10) • The mystery of Lawlessness is already at work. (2 Thess. 2:7). • Their <u>present age was evil</u> and told Christians to look for Christ's coming. (Titus 2:12-13) • End of Ages has come. (1 Cor 10:18)

Hebrews said those were the last days. (Heb. 1:2) The old things were ready to pass away. (Heb. 8:13) The way to the Holiest of All could not yet be manifested until the first tabernacle was still standing. (Heb. 9:8) 1st century Christians could see the day approaching (Heb. 10:25) They were eagerly awaiting his coming. (Heb. 10:28) In a little while, he who is coming will come and not delay. (Heb. 10:37)

John the Apostle said that the darkness <u>was passing away</u> and the true light was shining. (1 Jn. 2:8; 17) <u>It</u> was the last hour. (1 Jn. 2:18)

**Revelation** through John says that those things written must <u>soon take place.</u> (Rev. 1:1) The time <u>has</u> <u>come.</u> (Rev. 1:3) Every eye would see him including those who pierced him. (Rev. 1:7) The blood of the saints would be avenged <u>in a little while</u>. (Rev. 6:10-11; 18:20) Judgment would be against Jerusalem, where the Lord was crucified. (Rev. 11:8) Judgment would be against Jerusalem, the one who became drunk with the blood of the saints. (Rev. 16:6; 17:6; 18:24) The harvest of the earth <u>was ripe.</u> The harvest <u>had come.</u> (Rev. 14:15-16) The New Heavens and Earth is now present. The old things have passed away. (Rev. 21)

I wonder where the NT writers got this idea of an imminent return of the Lord?? Hmmmmm!

Come on, Folks!!!!!!!!! Let us awaken from this stupor we are in. For Heaven's sake, look at the above and see why we believe the Lord kept His promise to come back then.
