

~World without end~

The Bible tells us that the earth will never cease or end. The end of the world is a mistranslation of the end of the age. The Gk. word is 'aion' which is defined as age and not world. Most, if not all, modern versions of the Bible have corrected this error. For example: take Matthew 24:3

Matt 24:3

3 And as he sat upon the mount of Olives, the disciples came unto him privately, saying, Tell us, when shall these things be? and what shall be the sign of thy coming, and of the end of the world?
(KJV)

Matt 24:3

3 As Jesus was sitting on the Mount of Olives, the disciples came to him privately. "Tell us," they said, "when will this happen, and what will be the sign of your coming and of the end of the age?"
(NIV)

Matt 24:3

3 As He was sitting on the Mount of Olives, the disciples came to Him privately, saying, "Tell us, when will these things happen, and what { will be } the sign of Your coming, and of the end of the age?"
(NAU)

NOTE: In the context, the world is not even in question. The disciples were inquiring about the end of the Temple, the second coming and the end of the Jewish 'age'--not 'world' (meaning the entire earth and its population)!

Psalms 78:69 And he built his sanctuary like high palaces, like the *earth which he has established for ever.*

Ecclesiastes 1:4 One generation passes away, and another generation come but *the earth abides for ever.*

Ephesians 3:21 unto him be glory in the church by Christ Jesus *throughout all ages, world without end. Amen.*
